Concept:

The logo of the Gumbi-Gumbi Gardens is developed from the painting of Gumbi-Gumbi (*Pittosporum angustifolium*) plant (see image on the left). The shape of the leaves and nuts from the painting is symbolised to create a graphical form (see images on top) which facilitates the usage in all production methods, such as printing, publishing, engraving, die cutting, on any surface and materials.

Shape and Colour:

The shape of the logo is comprised of 3 squares, each represents a portion of the painting. When the 3 squares join together, the gumbi leaves can be connected in one piece (see images on top).

The joining and separating use of the 3 squares expresses the main theme of the Garden – “*Connect, Interconnect, Reconnect*”:

Connect the University with the community

Interconnect indigenous and nonindigenous people to move forward as one

Reconnect indigenous people with their land, history, culture.

The colours of the logo are developed based on the painting’s “earth” colour scheme.

Fonts:

The font used in this logo is Frutiger65. This font was previously used for the letter from Vice-Chancellor to the neighbours of the Gardens site. Also this font is in line with USQ’s corporate branding.

Usage:

General use (combining 3 squares)

It is suggested to use the logo in its combining form for general display and promotion. This is the basic and core branding which needs to be consistent (see top left image).

Expressing the main theme –
“*Connect, Interconnect, Reconnect*”

When the 3 elements of the main theme are to be expressed, the 3 squares can be used individually (see top right images).

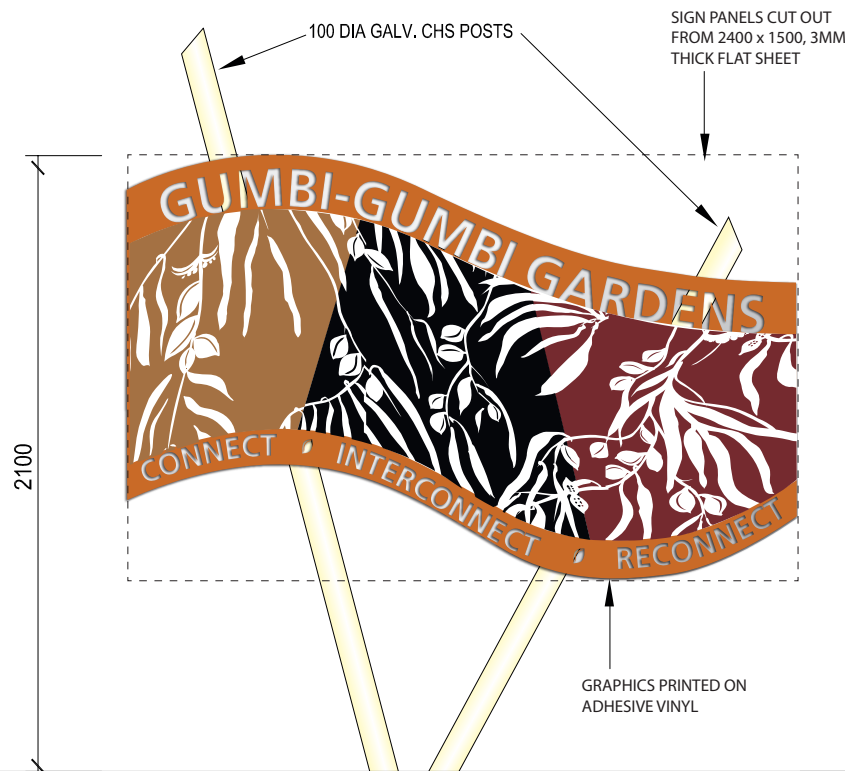

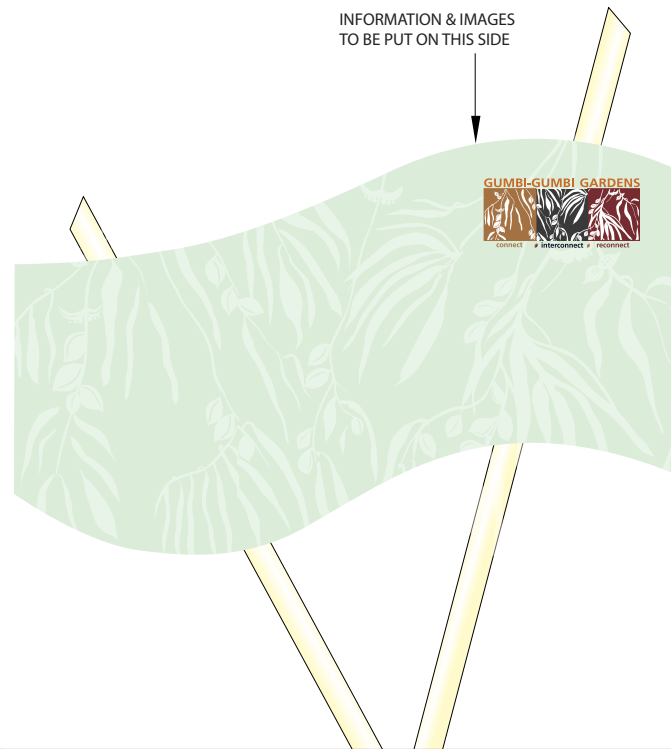
These Gardens tell the story of the growth journey we all take; learning from our past to inform our future. It is a story of mutual dependence, of walking and growing together and of confidence in the future.

Gardens Design Philosophy

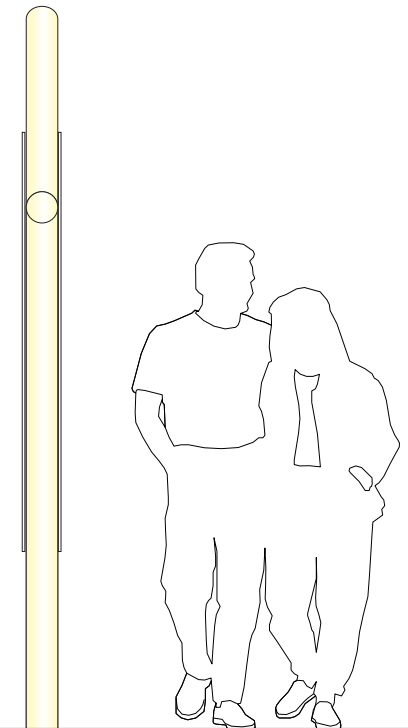
“Let us look at where we have been and where we are going, and through education make the journey together.”
